Hickling Class

This week in Hickling, the class have looked at why a river changes shape and have been taught vocabulary such as 'meander', 'oxbow lake', 'erosion' and 'desposition' - all topical words that help explain the journey of a river and its course. The children have also thought of lots of uses of rivers, considering the positive and negative effects of each use and the impact that they have. The class also now know more information about the River Nar.

In maths, the focus this week has been on negative numbers and looking at temperature differences using thermometer number line scales (negative numbers were quite apt for this week due to the temperatures!). We followed this up by learning about the order of number operations and which calculations to do first. Once again, the children have had a chance to complete Mathletics challenges.

Following on from our 'boxing up' of our class narrative 'The Canal', the children have looked at the text and picked out features to include when they come to write their own narrative - a writing toolkit. This week, we looked at powerful verbs, considering different language choices to make our writing more effective, and description of characters, focussing on features of characters to describe. Of course, we have continued our class reader as well, 'Timecruiser' by Chris Crowther, which follows the adventure of three children on the Norfolk Broads.

Reminders

Name ALL uniform; Please remember to write your child's name in all their school uniform and PE kit, this helps staff to reunite lost clothing with your child.


Office Hours; The office is open 8:30am – 3:30pm please leave a message on the answer phone outside of these hours.

If you arrive after 8:45am you will need to buzz the office and your child will be marked as late with the number of minutes recorded. The registers close at 8:55am arrival at 8:55am or after will be recorded as an unauthorised absence and will affect your child's attendance. Holidays; Holiday taken during term time will not be authorised and may results in a Fixed Penalty Notice of £60 being issued per child, per parent. So, for a family of four that could mean a fine of £240.00.

Wellies and Waterproofs; If possible please can all the children have wellies and waterproofs in school for outdoor learning. Their wellies and waterproofs can stay in school. Please can you name your child's wellies and waterproofs. Oulton Class Wednesday afternoon. Ranworth Class Tuesday afternoon. Hickling class Thursday afternoon.

Nuts – We are a nut free school.


