Ranworth Class

This week in Ranworth, we have been working on our protect 'Does adversity always make you stronger?'. We have been dissecting many different famous individuals, with their struggles and adversity and how they overcame it! We have also been using some own personal anecdotes from the class, being very sensible we have discussed whether we felt as though it made us stronger afterwards and have had quite the debate! We can't wait to show you our work and our thoughts too.

Oulton Class

In Oulton Class this week we have been practicing our handwriting to enter it for the Queen Mother's Handwriting competition. In Science we have been learning about healthy eating and as well as how to keep our pets healthy.

During our maths sessions Reception have been concentrating on using numbers up to 20 and Y1 and 2 have been learning about money and different denominations of coins. Our Outdoor Learning session was very exciting because we found a fairy tree and created a beautiful garden for the fairies using lots of natural resources which we found, such as feathers, blossom, twigs (which we made into a fairy swing) and pretty stones. We are really looking forward to World Book Day next Thursday and have enjoyed hearing about each other's ideas for costumes.

Hickling Class

This week in Hickling, the class have looked at flooding; types of flooding and what makes them worse, including who looks after different types of flooding. This has been especially apt with the recent floods that have occurred in Norfolk. Linked to this, the class have started looking at news reports about flooding and have planned their own. We have resumed our class reader as well, 'Timecruiser' by Chris Crowther, which follows the adventure of three children on the Norfolk Broads. They have travelled into the past and are now in Roman times. In maths, the focus this week has been on the relationship between fractions, decimals and percentages and finding percentages of numbers. Once again, the children have had a chance to complete Mathletics challenges.

Reminders

Registers; The school gate opens at 8:40am and closes at 8:45am. Registers in class are taken at 8;45am. If you arrive after 8:45am you will need to buzz the office and your child will be marked as late with the number of minutes recorded. The registers close at 8:55am arrival at 8:55am or after will be recorded as an unauthorised absence and will affect your child's attendance.

Holidays; Holiday taken during term time will not be authorised and may results in a Fixed Penalty Notice of £60 being issued per child, per parent. So, for a family of four that could mean a fine of £240.00.

Wellies and Waterproofs; If possible please can all the children have wellies and waterproofs in school for outdoor learning. Their wellies and waterproofs can stay in school. Please can you name your child's wellies and waterproofs. Oulton Class Wednesday afternoon. Ranworth Class Tuesday afternoon. Hickling class Thursday afternoon.

Chewing gum and cough sweets; Chewing gum is NOT allowed in school. If your child needs cough/throat lozenge in school then these must be brought to the office in the morning so they are supervised when eating them and not shared with other children.
